Average Development	Indicators that child may require OT input
o-18 Months children learn to: - Hold object using thumb and index finger - Stack 2-3 blocks in tower - Scribble using gross (whole hand) grasp - Develop isolation of index finger (pointing) - Turn pages of a book - Hold spoon with hand, licking food off spoon and using fingers to feed self	
2-3 years are expected to: - Build block tower 4-8 blocks - Copy drawing of prewriting shapes 1 - O - Use scissors to cut along line - Thread beads 3-4 years children are expected to:	- Not using two hands together in tasks such as feeding
- Draw basic stick figure - Begin to use proper pencil grasp - Emergence of hand preference	- No interest in drawing, painting or a using hands
4-5 years children are expected to:	
 Begin to learn to write letters Show more detail in drawing Use spoon and fork to eat with 	 Poor pencil grasp At this age a child should be adapting a tripod grasp rather than fisted grasp Scribbles with no interest in drawing recognisable shapes or figures Does not use same hand consistently when drawing
